NATIONAL COMMITTEES AT WORLD CONSERVATION CONGRESS



1st global meeting of IUCN National and Regional Committees

The 1st global meeting of National and Regional Committees was held at the World Conservation Congress, Honolulu, Hawai'i on 1st September 2016. It was supported by the IUCN President and was attended by 150 people representing national and regional committees from every IUCN region.

Resolution for National Committee Development

Motion 002, 'Developing a Global Group for National and Regional Committee Development,' was approved during the electronic voting process. A high degree of support from all 10 IUCN regions and 26 countries, notably 100% support from State Members.

IUCN - Be More Whale!

Both the outcomes of the global meeting and the motion process were presented to the WCC Member's Assembly at its 5th Sitting. The President's message "Members are the backbone of IUCN" was reinforced. As the world's largest network of environment experts, IUCN was encouraged to liken itself to the world's largest mammal and be more like a blue whale's backbone – strong, connected and flexible!

EUPAG meeting



The European Union (EU) Policy Advisory Group met at the Congress and again online in December. Most recent discussions were on the EU Biodiversity Policy & Agriculture, Sustainable Development Goals, Climate Change, Land use, Land-use change and forestry, the Paris Agreement and marine plastic litter.

The membership of the Advisory Group is also being revised to optimise the output from the group.

Project Postcard

Thanks to a good response from Members demonstrating their projects which help deliver the IUCN Global Programme, it was possible to create a dual-purpose desk calendar with usable postcards.

A calendar was presented to the IUCN President at a special lunch meeting he hosted for all the IUCN regional representatives. President Zhang is a strong advocate for National and Regional Committees and spoke supportively of them at the Congress.

Meeting up in Stockholm



In addition to its monthly online meetings, the Working Group for National Committee Development Europe, North and Central Asia will next meet in person on 15th/16th March 2017 at the Museum of Natural History in Stockholm, Sweden. The meeting will also be open to IUCN Member organisations, particularly from countries without National Committee representation.

Member Consultation on the establishment of an IUCN European Regional Committee

Now that National Committees have demonstrated that they can work together as a working group, the issue of whether this could evolve into a Pan-European Regional Committee has arisen.
