

Petition

Urges the countries of the Mediterranean to: coordinate actions to facilitate the culture of change within the fishing sector, encouraging sustainable development, promoting the importance of marine protected areas and following a participatory philosophy and methodology; recognize the value of traditional ecological knowledge that the artisanal fishing sector possesses and generate mechanisms

and alliances that allow it to be systematized and transferred to both the scientific community and the rest of society; to promote that the organizations of artisanal fishermen in the Mediterranean play an active role in the decision making on the design and implementation of the marine protected areas, in the sustainable management of the marine resources and, in short, to lead the movement for the conservation of the marine biodiversity; and to increase the tools of training of the organizations of artisanal fishermen to carry out this management, and to facilitate the advice and technical support on the part of the scientific institutions and NGOs in the different aspects. It urges the Director General to cooperate with the Mediterranean countries in the implementation of the actions.

Legislation:

<u>Law 5/2017</u>, of 10 February, on sea fishing and aquaculture of the Valencian Community. Small-scale fishing (traditional, with minor gears) is accepted as a suitable fishing method in the Community of Valencia.

Law 3/2020, of July 27, for the recovery and protection of the Mar Menor.

Resolution of June 1, 2021, of the General Secretariat for Fisheries, which establishes the provisions for the implementation of the bluefin tuna recovery plan in the Eastern Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea for 2021. Artisanal fishing will benefit from the new bluefin tuna plans

<u>Regulation (EU) 2022/109 of the Council of January 27, 2022</u> establishing for 2022 the fishing opportunities for certain stocks and groups of fish stocks applicable in Union waters and, in the case of fishing vessels of the Union, in certain non-Union waters.

Resolution of May 19, 2022, of the General Secretariat for Fisheries, establishing the provisions for the application of the multi-annual management plan for bluefin tuna in the eastern Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea for 2022.

Order PCM/1140/2022, of November 22, by which the Fisheries Science Board is created. Includes the National Federation of Artisanal Fishing (FENAPA).
