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Petition

Calls on Mediterranean countries to sign and ratify the Protocol on Integrated Coastal Zone Management in the Mediterranean, of the Barcelona Convention, formalized in Almeria in January 2008; and calls on IUCN's Mediterranean members to promote the objectives of the Protocol throughout the Mediterranean basin, as well as in local and/or regional actions. Urges the Director General to encourage the implementation of integrated management systems for the maritime-terrestrial strip of the Mediterranean coastal regions, both to benefit future generations and to maintain and conserve the natural and cultural values of the strip.

<u>Council Decision (EU) 2022/9 of 2 December 2021</u> on the position to be taken on behalf of the European Union at the 22nd meeting of the Contracting Parties to the Convention for the Protection of the Marine Environment and Mediterranean Coastal Region (Barcelona Convention) and its Protocols, regarding the adoption of a decision to modify the annex to the Protocol for the Prevention and Elimination of Pollution of the Mediterranean Sea Caused by Dumping from Ships and Aircraft or Incineration at Sea (Dumping Protocol).

Royal Decree 150/2023, of February 28, which approves the marine space management plans of the five Spanish marine demarcations. These plans will affect the management from the Mediterranean coast. Royal Decree 35/2023, of January 24, which approves the revision of the hydrological plans of the hydrographic demarcations of the Western Cantabrian, Guadalquivir, Ceuta, Melilla, Segura and Júcar, and the Spanish part of the hydrographic demarcations of Eastern Cantabrian, Miño-Sil, Duero, Tajo, Guadiana and Ebro. The correct revision of the hydrological plans which affect coastal zones will have a positive impact on coastal conservation.

<u>Law 9/2022</u>, of <u>November 23</u>, on the legal regime and procedural of the activities subject to integrated environmental authorization. This law affects the environmental management of coasts in the Balearic Islands.





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
