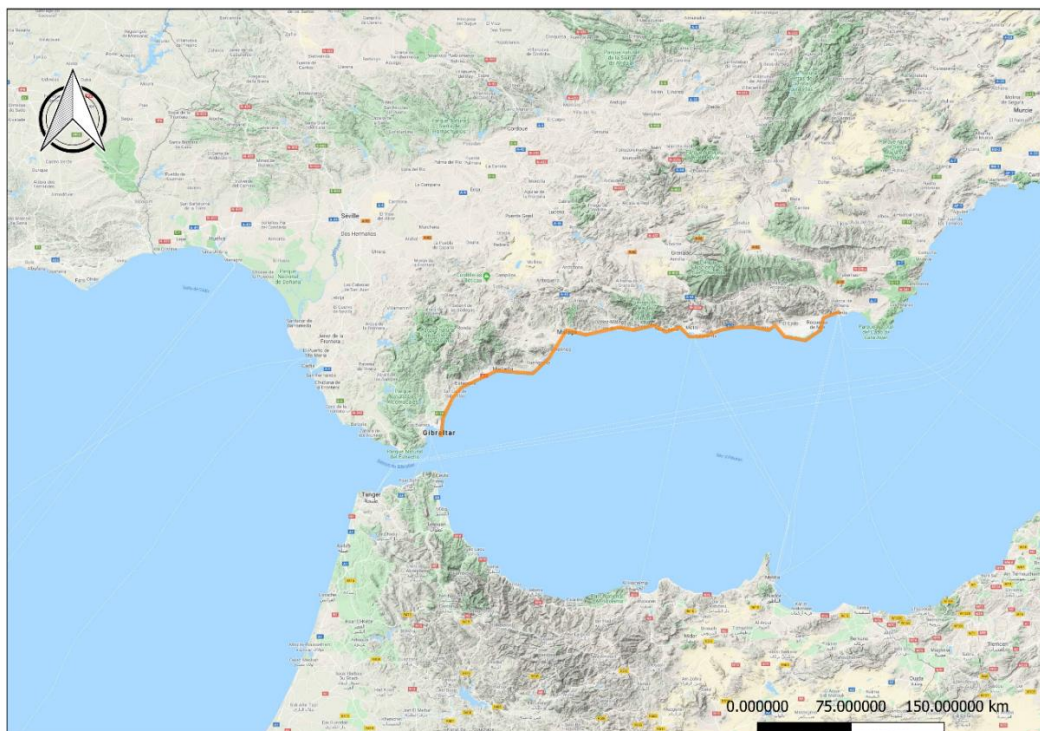

Summary of actions carried out with effect in Spain

“[Cordón Verde Litoral](#)” Project (2009 and 2015). Project of Aula del Mar in collaboration with several coastal town halls in the province of Malaga: Manilva, Estepona, Casares, Marbella, Mijas, Malaga, Rincón de la Victoria, Torrox and Nerja. And that later, from 2016 to the present, some of these municipalities have continued their work, merging into the [Senda Litoral](#), within the Gran Senda de Málaga, which is led by the Diputación de Málaga, and Aula del Mar continues to collaborate with this institution, producing records of coastal species, advising on the design and management of this coastal path, and more recently, on the development and implementation of a Blue Path, which includes spaces claimed by the Aula del Mar, for their special conservation, such as Los Baños del Carmen beach sea floor, which has been proposed as a Marine Reserve.

This initiative, promoted by CeUICN, Malaga City Council, Aula del Mar and Fundación Naturaleza y Hombre, whose main objective is to develop a green ring in the city of Malaga made up of natural areas, representative of the natural habitats existing in the area, physically and ecologically connected with each other and with the natural areas of the interior, especially those designated as Natura 2000 network and/or included in the Network of Natural Protected Areas of Andalusia (RENPA).
